  - Includes FWS Dir. and NOAA Adm.

- Bring collaboration among federal agencies and private sector

#### AMERICA THE BEAUTIFUL CHALLENGE – GRANT CATERGORIES

- States, Territories, and Tribal Implementation Grants
   Grants ranging from \$1 million to \$5 million; Non-federal match encouraged,
   but not required
- Planning, Collaboration and Engagement for States, Territories and Tribes
  - Grants of \$200,000 to \$1,000,000; Non-federal match encouraged, but not required
- Grants to Buffer and Benefit Public Lands (i.e., DOD, NFS)\*
  Grants ranging from \$250,000 to \$1.5 million; 10-20% Non-federal match
- **Private Forests, Rangeland and Farmland Grants\***Grants ranging from \$200,000 to \$500,000 (aligned with NRCS Working Lands for Wildlife); 1:1 Non-federal match

### NATIONAL COASTAL RESILIENCE FUND


- Delivered in partnership with NOAA, DOD, and private funding partners
- Targets all coastal HUC-8 watersheds that drain to the sea and any adjacent HUC 8 watersheds that are particularly low-lying or tidally influenced
